Transatlantic Leadership Seminar on Faith, Leadership, and Power

Rome, Istanbul, and London November 11th to 18th, 2018 Thematic Agenda Please note that the agenda is still subject to change.

The 2018 Transatlantic Leadership Seminar on Faith, Leadership, and Power will take a cohort of 25 leaders from Europe and the United States to Rome, Istanbul, and London to explore how faith informs leadership across sectors in today's world. Participants will have a unique opportunity to engage with more than 40 leaders in intimate, frank, and dynamic conversations and learn how spirituality shapes their values, priorities, and norms. Solutions to pressing contemporary issues will also be explored, while group reflection and debriefs will help participants identify key leadership takeaways.

Rome, Italy and Vatican City

(November 11th-13th)

The Seminar will begin with a welcome reception, which will allow participants to get to know each other, share their reasons for having joined the Seminar, and reflect on the ways spirituality or values have influenced their own leadership trajectory. The program will then shift its focus to examine the way that faith has been shaping society since antiquity; the contributions that Judaism and Christianity have made to Western conceptions of morality, community, and solidarity; and the influence that these two faiths continue to have on public perceptions, discourse, and policy. The cohort will also explore the ongoing efforts of the Holy See to foster reconciliation between nations and faiths and help set a moral compass for the high levels of migration that are so profoundly impacting the public discourse on both sides of the Atlantic.

Istanbul, Turkey

(November 13th-15th)

The Seminar will then move on to Istanbul, the city that used to be the capital of one of the most powerful caliphates in the Islamic world - the Ottoman Empire - and today, houses the most majestic monuments of that period and the preceding Orthodox Christian Byzantium. Participants will here explore the way Islam informs politics in Turkey today; the full diversity of Islamic thought, movements, and denominations; and the intricate relationship of this global faith with modernity. The program will pay special attention to the way Islam guides community life and charity, as well as the way Orthodox Christianity perceives contemporary trends and coexists with Islam and other Christian denominations. The last day will include a visit to historical sites including the Blue Mosque and Hagia Sophia, of which the later was a wonder of Byzantine architecture that served both as the patriarchal basilica and the imperial mosque before becoming a blue print for all Orthodox temples worldwide, a museum, and a UNESCO world heritage site.

London, the United Kingdom

(November 16th-17th)

The Seminar will end in one of the most diverse capitals in Europe, which only recently elected mayor Sadiq Khan, who as the first Muslim to hold this office took his oath on his own Koran and left it in the custody of the state for the use of future mayors. The program will first look at the policies of inclusion that have enabled a society as diverse as the United Kingdom's to be stable, vibrant, and prosperous for so long. The focus will then shift to the implications of Britain's recent decision to leave the European Union; the backlash against minorities that this decision has generated; the challenge minorities face in achieving accurate representation; and the ways in which exchanges among secular and faith based voices are generating shifts on key social issues. The program will pay special attention to the unique position of the Church of England and its active role in the affairs of the state as a partner of government and other faiths.

Optional Add-On (November 18th)

Participants will have the opportunity to extend their stay for another day and enjoy a relaxing group excursion at the end of the program to Canterbury.
