







More Jobs Have Been Created Than In Any Year Since 1939

Annual job gains and losses






Unemployment at 3.9% is Near a Record Low




S&P 500 closing highs, by year


Q: Biden has been president for about 10 months. Would you say he has accomplished...



12-month change in Consumer Price Index


January 2019 to November 2021






The Public Blames Biden for High Gas Prices

Do you think that the increase in the price of gasoline has been caused by the Biden administration policies or do you think that the increase is not due to their policies?







Republicans anticipate a year-ahead inflation rate of 6.8%, over double the expected 3% rate among Democrats



M2. In general, do you think the American economy is on the right track or is it off on the wrong track?




Views on the major International Challenges Facing the Country

Jobs & the Economy and the Pandemic Remain Top Priorities for Americans, But They Want a Focus on the Economy

Majorities say "jobs and the economy" (55%) and the pandemic (54%) are top priorities for Biden and Congress; 59% say they see Biden and Congress focusing on the pandemic, though just 31% say the same of the economy.

Which of these issues do you feel President Joe Biden and Congress are actually most focused on?








If an armed conflict were to arise between Russia and Ukraine, should the U.S. help protect Ukraine militarily from Russia


Percentage of Americans Who View Foreign Trade as Economic Opportunity, by Party


What do you think foreign trade means for America? Do you see foreign trade more as an opportunity for economic growth through increased U.S. exports or a threat to the economy from foreign imports?








On average, since the Truman Era, a president's party loses more than 29 House seats in his first midterm election. (This year, Republicans need to pick up just 5 seats to win back the House.) But in the seven times when that president's job-approval rating was below 50 percent, his party lost an average of 43 House seats





Who controls how the U.S. House districts are drawn?









Politicians Drawing Boundaries Leads to This:

The Current Third District in Maryland








Do you believe that Joe Biden's victory in the 2020 presidential election was legitimate or not legitimate?




About 4 in 10 Republicans and independents say violent action against the government is sometimes justified
