The intersection of financial markets, transatlantic trade, and economic security is increasingly shaping the future of Central and Eastern Europe. This panel will explore how regional financial ecosystems are evolving in response to global trends, from the rise of capital markets and the growing role of private equity and venture capital, to the digital transformation of financial services. A special focus will be placed on sustainable finance as a driver of long-term growth and resilience. Discussions will also examine the region's deeper integration into global financial networks, the impact of geopolitical risks on investment flows, and how CEE economies are positioning themselves as emerging hubs for innovation and capital. By linking the transatlantic economic agenda with developments in the CEE financial landscape, the panel will assess both the opportunities and vulnerabilities that define the region's path forward.

In a rapidly evolving geopolitical and technological landscape, the foundations of prosperity and security rely on resilient digital ecosystems. Rules-based trade and investment frameworks, secure cross-border connectivity, and collaborative research and innovation are essential to safeguarding both economic competitiveness and democratic resilience. This panel will bring together diverse stakeholders from leading global technology players, alongside policymakers, regulators, and experts from security and research communities. Discussions will explore how to align digital transformation with digital resilience and security imperatives, from AI innovation and dual-use technologies to next-generation telecom infrastructure, while also looking at the role of transatlantic cooperation in ensuring Europe's competitiveness while upholding democratic values and open markets.
